For me, it is a beautiful expression of the Festival's true essence, cultivating the values that Claude Nobs passed on to us 10 years ago. The line-up is full of skilfully orchestrated artistic combinations, major figures from the history of music in small settings, current sensations and, above all, the legends of tomorrow.

In the face of this instability and nervousness regarding the future, we wish to offer you this 57<sup>th</sup> edition as a humble antidote, which we hope will transport you into a timeless bubble, an experience that is both musical and human, and which evokes intense emotions.

I look forward to sharing these moments with you this summer.



## **BOB DYLAN** SATURDAY 01 JULY

His presence is always an event: Bob Dylan will be in Montreux this summer to present *Rough and Rowdy Ways* exclusively in Switzerland. Part acoustic folk, part electric blues, this 2020 album is considered by his fans and critics to be one of his best of the last thirty years. Fueled by the brilliant inspiration of his new songwriting material, Dylan's current tour has received international critical acclaim. His appearance at the Auditorium Stravinski will mark his first concert in French-speaking Switzerland for ten years. At the artist's request, the hall will be fully seated to reflect the intimate atmosphere of his tour.

# LIONEL RICHIE MONDAY 03 JULY

An international superstar with a peerless discography, Lionel Richie's music is part of the fabric of pop music. He has sold over 100 million albums and, amongst other accolades, has been recognized with an Oscar, a Golden Globe and four Grammy Awards. He is known for his massive smash hits including "All Night Long", "Hello", and "Say You, Say Me" and unforgettable collaborations like "Endless Love" with his friend Diana Ross, as well as co-writing one of the most important pop songs in history, "We Are the World," for USA for Africa. Lionel Richie has conquered the hearts of faithful fans for five decades and continues to tour all over the world. In 2015, he ended his concert in Montreux by inviting Quincy Jones to the stage for a poignant rendition of "We Are the World". Lionel Richie will perform this summer for the third time at the Montreux Jazz Festival.





# CHRIS ISAAK SUNDAY 02 JULY

With his smooth voice and atmospheric reverbs, Chris Isaak has forged a unique musical signature, transcending his rockabilly and country influences. The sensual and immortal "Wicked Game" is the most inspiring example. Covered by everyone (R.E.M., London Grammar, Tori Amos, Céline Dion and others), this hit owes part of its success to its iconic black and white video, shot on a beach in Hawaii with model Helena Christensen. In the United States, David Lynch's protégé is a true pop culture icon, known for his cult appearances in film and television, notably in *Friends, Twin Peaks* and *The Silence of the Lambs*. But it was the musician who was honoured last year by his peers at the Americana Music Awards. After Johnny Cash, Willie Nelson and Bonnie Raitt, it was his turn to receive a *Lifetime Achievement Award*.

# **MAVIS STAPLES**

#### MONDAY 10 JULY

A legend more in tune with the times than ever. A soul and gospel legend since the sixties, Mavis began her career with the Staple Singers. With her father and sisters, she scored hits like "This May Be The Last Time", later covered by the Rolling Stones, and fought alongside Martin Luther King by recording several freedom songs. Today, the music world is still crazy about the voice of Mavis Staples. In the last five years, Ben Harper, Aloe Blacc, Buddy Guy, Sheryl Crow, Nick Cave, Arcade Fire, Gorillaz and Jon Batiste have all worked with her.

# NORAH JONES


Norah Jones is one of those artists who touches the soul and appeals to all audiences, whether young or old, and lovers of soul, blues or jazz. If we were to trace her hits, we would start with the timeless "Don't Know Why" for which she won her first Grammy award in the early 2000s. Twenty years and 50 million albums sold later, Norah Jones still has her finger on the pulse with her multifaceted music, which continues to surprise with each new listen and leaves a feeling of eternity. After appearances at Montreux in 2007 and 2010 she will be back on stage at the Auditorium Stravinski to showcase her hits in a new light.



### 70 years of music history at the Stravinski

The programme at the Auditorium Stravinski covers every decade from the late 1950s to today. A dazzling panorama of music history, with a strong emphasis on the 60s and 70s, as well as the last decade.





# LIL NAS X TUESDAY 04 JULY

Singer, rapper, queer activist and fashion icon, the phenomenon Lil Nas X is coming to Switzerland for the first time. The Atlanta native revealed himself to the world in 2019 with the countrytrap UFO "Old Town Road", which spent a record 19 weeks on top of the US charts. Adored by Quincy Jones and Nicki Minaj, collaborating with Doja Cat, Miley Cyrus or Elton John, this this force of nature never ceases to win over everything, redefining the codes of the genre in its path. With his first album *Montero*, Lil Nas X completely blurs the lines between pop, hip-hop and R&B, allowing him to assert himself well beyond the initial buzz of the cowboy rapper. Captivating, explosive and eclectic, the universe of an XXL American star takes over the Auditorium Stravinski this summer.

### MALUMA TUESDAY 11 JULY

A journey that started in the streets of Medellín and which has infused the entire world's sound system - such is the trajectory of Juan Luis Londoño Arias. Somewhere between reggaeton and Latin pop, Maluma has taken his place among the greats, becoming one of the most popular artists of his generation. Under his belt: several billion views on YouTube, albums that consistently defy the bestseller charts and a recent nomination for the 2023 Grammy Awards. The Montreux Jazz Festival has always had a strong link with Latin music, with legends such as Carlos Santana, Gilberto Gil, Caetano Veloso and more recently Sean Paul, Juanes or Anitta. A history that naturally lives on this summer with the Colombian star, who will thrill the audience at the Stravinski with his hits "El Perdedor", "Felices los 4" and "Hawái".

# "Having the time of my life at Montreux Jazz Festival. This Festival reminds me why I love music so much."

- In 2017 **Sam Smith** came to enjoy the festival even though they were not in the line-up that year. A few lucky people were able to see them sing late into the night during a jam session with an African kora player. The event poster by Malika Favre is now displayed in their home. The Brit is now back on top with a fifth single that's on its way to over a billion streams. They will play for the first time at the Stravinski this summer, eight years after their concert at the Lab.

# Generation X + Sex Pistols = Generation Sex

A dream line-up for all punk lovers. On the Generation X side, we have the legendary peroxide-blonde singer **Billy Idol** and bassist **Tony James**, both founders of the group in 1976. For the Pistols, drummer **Paul Cook** and guitarist **Steve Jones** both played on the legendary album *Never Mind the Bollocks*. As well as having invented the most iconic punk-rock guitar riffs, Steve Jones also played most of the bass lines during the recording. The reason? Because scandalous Sid Vicious wasn't up to scratch...

# **BUDDY GUY**

#### FRIDAY 14 JULY

Buddy Guy is a Chicago Blues legend, but his story began in Louisiana. Born in 1936 on a plantation 140 miles from New Orleans, Buddy was only seven years old when he made his first makeshift two-string guitar. In 1957, he went to Chicago and took part in numerous sessions for Chess Records alongside Howlin' Wolf and Muddy Waters. Known for his incendiary guitar style, he is ranked among the top 25 players of all time by Rolling Stone magazine. He influenced a whole generation of blues-rock guitarists such as Eric Clapton, Jimi Hendrix and Stevie Ray Vaughan. Buddy Guy's history at Montreux dates back to 1974. That year he accompanied Muddy Waters alongside his loyal harmonica player Junior Wells and Rolling Stones bassist Bill Wyman. Almost fifty years later, he will take part in his 13th edition of the Festival.



# JOE BONAMASSA FRIDAY 14 JULY

"You will be a legend before you're 25", B.B. King predicted when he was only... 12 years old. Thirty years later, the American guitar hero continues to shake the blues-rock world at breakneck speed. His guitars (with this compulsive collector, the plural is necessary) sound powerful and menacing when playing with supergroup Black Country Communion, tender and melodic with Beth Hart, or mean and wickedly groovy with Rock Candy Funk Party. Joe Bonamassa regularly pays tribute to his heroes: the "3 Kings" (B.B., Albert & Freddie), on the album *Live at the Greek Theatre*, or his absolute masters Clapton, Beck and Page, on *British Blues Explosion*. In 2012, he participated in *Re-Machined*, a reinterpretation of Deep Purple's legendary album, recorded you know where... This summer, Joe Bonamassa will perform for the third time at the Montreux Jazz Festival.

# Ten Grammy Awards later...

This selfie of **Jon Batiste** and **Jacob Collier** was taken at the Auditorium Stravinski in 2016 during a concert with Quincy Jones. The two virtuosos have since won five Grammy Awards! Jacob Collier was rewarded in 2017, 2020 and 2021. Jon Batiste made a clean sweep in 2021, including the most prestigious award for best album. An anthology evening awaits the audience at the Stravinski, with these two children of the Festival who have become ubiquitous on the jazz music scene and beyond.

One prefers the kimono, the other the bathrobe. But both share a certain love for the offbeat, bringing out their virtuosity in a highly singular and personalised manner. Above all, Chilly and Sofiane have managed to attract a real following for their mainly instrumental music, a rare occurrence in a music industry dominated by vocals. In Montreux, these two giants of the piano will be brought together on the same evening for the very first time.






### SEAL WEDNESDAY 12 JULY

A polymorphous artist with multiple influences, Seal boasts the freedom to be able to do it all, from soul to pop, including forays into dance music. All this with disconcerting skill. In three decades, his voice, which can be heard among all those he has inspired since, has not aged a day. An Englishman with Chadian and Nigerian roots, Seal draws what moves him from his musical heart. The result is hits such as "Kiss from a Rose", "Crazy" and "Love's Divine" and 30 million albums sold worldwide. Just as several artists have covered his songs (Alanis Morissette, George Michael and others), Seal regularly revisits his favourites (such as James Brown, Curtis Mayfield and Stevie Wonder). He came to Montreux four times between 2004 and 2011 and will return to the Auditorium Stravinski to play the anthems that made his career.

# **GILBERTO GIL**

#### FRIDAY 07 JULY

Gilberto Gil is quite simply one of the greatest cultural figures of our era. During 60+ years in music and politics, he has driven a cultural revolution in Brazil, was the founding father of the *tropicália* movement, the minister of culture, a UN ambassador and a UNESCO Artist for Peace. But above all, the Salvador de Bahia native has a discography under his belt as brilliant as it is abundant (over 60 albums!). His first visit to Montreux was in 1978, an event that marked the beginning of a long love affair between Brazilian artists and the Festival. In 2022, he celebrated his 80<sup>th</sup> birthday on a tour captured by Amazon Prime cameras as part of a hit series about his family. His children and relatives will be with him on stage for his 15<sup>th</sup> concert in Montreux.



## "Let's Dance", a hit born in Montreux with Nile Rodgers

In 1982 **Nile Rodgers** was at David Bowie's place near Montreux. One morning, Bowie rushed into Rodgers' room shouting "I think I've got a hit!". He proceeded to play the opening notes of "Let's Dance" on acoustic guitar. Finding it too folky for his taste, Nile Rodgers asked him if he could make it a little funkier. The two musicians then worked on the new record at the Mountain Studio in Montreux. We all know how the story ends.... The demo version, recorded in Montreux, was released a lot later in 2018.





# The *Montreux* Simply Red album

In 1992, **Simply Red** published an EP recorded the same year at the Festival. Out of the four titles, three are covers of jazz, soul and rhythm & blues classics. "Their interpretation of 'Drowning In My Own Tears' has managed to make me forget the legendary Ray Charles version," writes Claude Nobs in the album sleeve. The EP climbed to the 11<sup>th</sup> place in the British charts.

## When Janelle Monáe met Prince in Montreux

In 2010, a friend of the Festival snuck backstage incognito to attend **Janelle Monáe**'s first concert in Montreux: a certain... Prince! He wasn't in the line-up of the edition, he had simply wanted to attend Montreux as a spectator. He became mentor of the Atlanta singer, and worked on the early stages of what became *Dirty Computer*, one of the best albums of 2018.

### PAT METHENY THURSDAY 13 JULY

A prodigy with a dizzying career. Born into a musical family, Pat Metheny began working with the best jazz musicians in Kansas City at the age of 15. At the age of 19, he became a professor at the renowned *Berklee College of Music* and entered the international jazz scene a year later, quickly establishing himself as one of the world's top guitarists. To date, Pat Metheny has won 20 Grammy Awards, making him the 15<sup>th</sup> most awarded artist in history. A collaborator of David Bowie, Herbie Hancock and Steve Reich, the guitarist was also a forerunner in the development of electronic music. Instantly recognisable, his playing blends supple and flexible articulations with a rhythmic and harmonic sensitivity of unequalled richness. In Montreux, Pat Metheny has performed with John Scofield, Jack DeJohnette, Herbie Hancock, Charlie Haden and Brad Mehldau. This summer, he celebrates his return 11 years after his last visit to Montreux.

# MARCUS MILLER THURSDAY 13 JULY

The composer, arranger and multi-instrumentalist Marcus Miller is one of the most influential musicians of his era. Since the mid-1970s, the bassist has played on more than 500 albums and collaborated with Aretha Franklin, George Benson and Al Jarreau, not forgetting Miles Davis, for whom he wrote and produced *Tutu* in 1986. Now focused on his solo career, the slap master has released over a dozen albums and composed around 20 film soundtracks. Always keen to convey a message in addition to his unstoppable groove, his most renowned releases are *Afrodeezia* – a tribute to his ancestors, and *Laid Back*, a formidable synthesis of R&B, funk, hip-hop and jazz. A firm favourite at the Montreux Jazz Festival since his first appearance in 1981, Marcus Miller left an indelible mark in 1997 with "Legends", an ephemeral supergroup formed with Steve Gadd, Joe Sample, Eric Clapton and David Sanborn.

# AVA MAX WEDNESDAY 12 JULY

What does it take to make a hit? Obviously, Ava Max is the right person to ask. With her hits "Sweet but Psycho" and "Kings & Queens", the pop star has become an international sensation, particularly in Europe where she is ranked no.1 in some twenty countries, including Switzerland. A beautiful saga for the American with Albanian origins who could not picture herself doing anything else but music. Ava Max is keeping up the momentum with her second album, *Diamonds & Dancefloors*, filled with potential summer hits with eighties dance pop flavours. After Dua Lipa in 2017 and Rita Ora in 2019, the Montreux Jazz Lab will once again welcome a leading pop star.

## CHRISTINE AND THE QUEENS WEDNESDAY 05 JULY

Since the beginning of his career, Christine and the Queens has taken a number of different paths. Starting in Nantes, he has, in the space of ten years, shaken the whole world. And if we're talking on a global scale, it's because Chris has radiated his talent well beyond the borders of France. His first album, *Chaleur Humaine*, sold over a million copies and single-handedly redefined the contours of pop music in all its forms, especially the freer ones. An artist with a thousand and one facets, Chris frees himself from codes and genres by offering a more intimate music than ever. Produced by Mike Dean (Lana Del Rey, Beyonce, The Weeknd and others), his next album, *PARANOÏA*, *ANGELS*, *TRUE LOVE*, is released on 9 June. Chris describes it as "the key to openhearted transformation, a prayer for the Self that breathes and comes alive through all the love of which it is composed".





# **REMA** TUESDAY 04 JULY

He is the new face of the Nigerian scene. Straight from Benin City, the young star is making waves in the charts all over the world, taking all the playlists of our summers with him. His hits "Calm Down" and "Soundgasm", both from his first album *Rave & Roses*, are emblematic of his multiple pop and trap influences. He owes his place in the limelight to his accomplished mastery of melody, honed in the church pews he attended throughout his childhood. Not to mention his famous androgynous voice, which gets the hips swaying and the shoulders moving. A raw talent that puts Nigeria even more on the map of current global sounds.

#### An explosive line-up

Mark Ronson will bring together artists from his talented family, including some of his most loyal collaborators. On the

horns and rhythm section is a prestigious backing band made up of musicians who played for Mark Ronson on the single "Uptown Funk" and on the albums he produced for Amy Winehouse.

Two of the most sought-after special guests on today's American scene will also be present. A collaborator of

As always, the Montreux rap night offers a preview of future headliners. From rookie to heavyweight, the handover will be done the right way. **Khali** will lead the way with his elusive timbre, followed by the phenomenon **So La Lune** whose voice reaches for the stars.

**Kerchak**'s precision, **SDM**'s cheekiness and the inescapable flow of a new boss of the genre, **Zola**, will conclude the evening. It's all about nodding your head and increasing the BPMs on the lakeside.

### THE ROSE THURSDAY 06 JULY

Spearheading a new emerging scene, South Korean band The Rose lives up to its name. At the convergence of the softness of its petals and the sharpness of its thorns, this four-piece band intends to blur the lines by not identifying itself with any specific musical genre. Their motto? To play the music they like, whether it's rock or K-pop. With a real taste for experimentation, Woosung, Dojoon, Jaehyeong and Hajoon blend their voices and instruments in tracks that sound as electric as they do sensual.

In October 2022, the quartet released their third album, *Heal*, after a two-year absence. Sung in Korean and English, these ten tracks clearly won over an audience determined to break down language barriers.

## MAISIE PETERS THURSDAY 06 JULY

Maisie Peters' music is a love letter. Both delicate and incisive, tinged with a hint of nostalgia, it is the kind of music that stays in your head and doesn't leave. Born in Brighton, Maisie Peters wrote her first original songs as a teenager. With a vivid imagination and a gift for the art of melody, she had already recorded over 100 songs by the age of 13. A few years later, the young pop star racked up millions of streams with her single "Worst of you" and reached number two in the UK charts with her debut album *You Signed Up For This*. Ed Sheeran's protégé will perform at the Montreux Jazz Lab ten years after her mentor. A clear destiny.

# A piano prodigy takes on pop

**Ethan Bortnick** was only 9 years old when he was named "World's Youngest Solo Touring Musician" by Guinness in 2010. The young American, now 22, puts his mastery to work in a dark and ultra-contemporary Billie Eilish-style pop, punctuated by spectacular piano flights.





# Dan Auerbach, third Hermano

The Swiss guitar duo **Hermanos Gutiérrez** seduced a certain Dan Auerbach, half of the Black Keys and a reputable producer (Dr. John, Lana Del Rey, Ray LaMontagne, CeeLo Green, Bombino, etc.) with their brilliant Latino western sounds. In addition to producing the album *El Bueno Y El Mano*, Auerbach joined them on guitar on the aptly named 'Tres Hermanos'. A consecration for the two brothers, revealed notably by their MJF Spotlight Session in 2021.

# The return of Tamino to Montreux

In April 2018, the Belgian singer performed at the Festival's press conference, and was touted as a programmers' favourite. He played at the Montreux Jazz Lab the same year as a certain Angèle who also made her debut. The two compatriots collaborated earlier this year on the single 'Sunflower' from **Tamino**'s new album.





# CAROLINE POLACHEK

#### Singer-songwriter, performer, lyricist, musician... Caroline Polachek is a true all-rounder. Critically acclaimed for her adventurous and sophisticated pop, she has as many identities and aliases as paths she explores. With a background in Japanese music and indie rock, she succeeds in taking us to a dreamlike planet where different atmospheres intertwine. Her latest album *Desire, I Want To Turn Into You* is a formidable collection of sonic paintings. We can recognise her desire to create surprise by

positioning herself where she is not expected. One thing is

for sure: she will be found at the Lab at the crossroads of the avant-garde and mainstream, mixing electro and organic, melancholy and euphoria.

# CAVETOWN MONDAY 03 JULY

Cavetown was drawn to music as a child. A musicians' son with a gift for music, he learned to play the guitar at the age of eight, wrote his first songs and turned his teenage bedroom into a home studio. A few years later, the spark really ignited on YouTube and Bandcamp. Cavetown shared his first songs and quickly built up a community that identifies with his deep, intimate lyrics. Tinged with indie rock and folk, his pop melodies make his increasingly hooked fans dance and shiver in equal measure. This is reflected by the success of his songs "Boys will be bugs", "Devil town" and "This is home", each of which has amassed over 300 million streams.

# Electronic variations

# Friday nights at the Lab will be dedicated to some of the biggest names on the current electronic scene.

For the opening night of the Festival, the three Australians of **RÜFÜS DU SOL** will take over the Lab stage with one of their amazing live sets. Recently awarded at the Grammy Awards, the synthetic trio is more than ever considered as one of the capital formations of the world electro-pop scene.

On July 7, 2023, **Worakls** will be joined by a 20-piece orchestra to fuse two worlds that have more in common than you might think: electro and classical music. His latest album **Orchestra** offers tracks that sound like short films, so much so that they are pictorial. Music without a word but which says a lot.

The evening of July 14, 2023 will be a family story. The two cousins of **The Blaze** will present their famous electro-house tracks, between elastic grooves and corroded voices, while the two British brothers of **Overmono** will transcend their love of the nineties with an ultra-contemporary fusion of genres. Techno, trance, rave, garage, drum & bass or hardcore: nothing escapes the dizzying talent of these two brothers of sound.

# THE TESKEY BROTHERS TUESDAY 11 JULY

The Teskey Brothers is the story of two brothers from a farming family in rural Melbourne. Since childhood, they have been listening to American soul and R'n'B artists like Peter Green, Otis Redding and Ray Charles. They started out playing in the street, at local parties and in pubs. Josh handles the rhythm guitar parts and vocals, drawing his audience into oceans of emotion, while his brother Sam's languid solos make even the toughest blush. The Teskey Brothers quickly exported themselves across the Pacific with their fiery interpretation of soul music, as relentless on record as on stage.

# CALUM SCOTT SUNDAY 02 JULY

Calum Scott's life, revealed through his music, challenges, touches and shakes. Through deep and honest pop, the British artist who appeared on *Britain's Got Talent* in 2015 invites us to be swept away. And it works: his cover of 'Dancing on my own' has passed the one billion stream mark on Spotify. While he knows perfectly well how to make solitude sound appealing, Calum Scott also succeeds in offering a collective experience during his concerts, creating timeless moments with his audience. *Bridges*, his second album released in 2022, approaches intimacy with modesty and prowess, offering personal songs that speak to everyone, all with a powerful, crystal-clear voice. Goosebumps guaranteed.

# The trio that seduced Kendrick Lamar's producer

Driven by the breathtaking voice of Jacob Lusk (former backing singer for Diana Ross and Gladys Knight), **Gabriels** takes us into a time capsule. For their first album, the trio have secured the the services of Sounwave, the faithful collaborator of rapper Kendrick Lamar, who visited Montreux in 2013. The Compton producer also worked with FKA Twigs, Beyoncé and Taylor Swift before falling under the spell of Gabriels.





"We decided to form Wet Leg after a completely crazy IDLES concert. The idea started off as a joke. We laughed imagining getting into the summer festivals for free."

- **Wet Leg**, who will play the same night as IDLES in Montreux, five years after moshing during their concert at the End of the Road. With their witty lyrics and heady bass lines, Hester Chambers and Rhian Teasdale have conquered the Indie British scene at a dazzling pace. Earlier this year, the Isle of Wight duo even scooped two Grammy Awards on the other side of the Atlantic, including Best Alternative Album.



### FREYA RIDINGS WEDNESDAY 05 JULY

Freya Ridings' music weaves a direct line between her piano notes and our heartstrings. Unveiled in the summer of 2018 thanks to the success of her track "Lost Without You", the British artist has been on target ever since. With a warm voice that she wields like an instrument, she shook up the charts again a year later with the sublime "Castles". An emblematic song of her elegant pop that catches us cold because it is so honest and intimate. While you might think that its melancholy makes it isolating, the music of the talented Freya has the opposite effect, taking on a liberating dimension when shared. So much so that her first two albums were recorded in public, in an intimate and suspended atmosphere. Her return to the airwaves with the disco-esque "Weekends" heralded a concert that was both smooth and hard-hitting.

# JULIETTE ARMANET

#### SUNDAY 09 JULY

Juliette Armanet is equally at home with French chanson, pop and disco. Her lyrics, tinged with melancholy and a good dose of self-mockery, evoke sweet sentimental foolishness. In 2018 her debut album *Petite Amie* was certified double platinum and won the award for best new album at the Victoires de la Musique. After collaborations with her heroes (Véronique Sanson, Christophe and others), the girl from Lille released the album *Brûler le Feu* in 2022. A disco spark that becomes a blaze, both on the radio and on stage, where her show takes on a new dimension.

# MJF Spotlight discoveries



# Guillaume Grando (SupaKitch) designs the poster for the 57<sup>th</sup> edition

The Montreux Jazz Festival has invited French artist Guillaume Grando to create the official poster for 2023. The work honours Lake Geneva, so emblematic of the image and history of the Festival.

Radical and enigmatic, the poster for the 57<sup>th</sup> Montreux Jazz Festival depicts the night-time ripples of Lake Geneva, illuminated by the event's lively waterfront. The letters of the Montreux Jazz Festival, distorted by the movement of the water, seem to dance in the depths of the lake.

The poster is the result of a complex process used in many of Guillaume Grando's works. On a wooden support, the French artist applies several layers of acrylic and resin, sanded and sculpted to reproduce the texture of water and its reflections. Once the physical object was completed, various photographs of the work were used to form the image of the poster, to which the typography was added digitally.

#### Lake Geneva, symbol of the Montreux Jazz Festival

Lake Geneva is emblematic of the Montreux Jazz Festival image. It is portrayed on numerous album covers, sung in Deep Purple's anthem "Smoke on the Water", and each year, welcomes both its guests and performers to swim out and soak in its beauty. Yet it has rarely been represented on official posters. After Bruno Gaeng's postcard poster (1974), Per Arnoldi's swan-saxophone (1994) and Zep's mermaids (2005), Guillaume Grando revisits this symbol of the Montreux landscape.

#### **About Guillaume Grando**

Guillaume Grando (aka SupaKitch) is a French multidisciplinary artist of international renown. Born in the suburbs of Paris in 1978, he started graffiti at a very young age under the name SupaKitch. Today, his formal research focuses on the essence of gesture, movement, light and matter, which become the central aspects of his approach. His next exhibitions are scheduled at the Artcan Gallery in Marseille, the Cohle Gallery in Menorca and the Galerie Barthelemy Bouscayrol in Biarritz. A printed edition of one of his works will be released at the end of the year by the legendary Parisian publishing house *Idem*.




